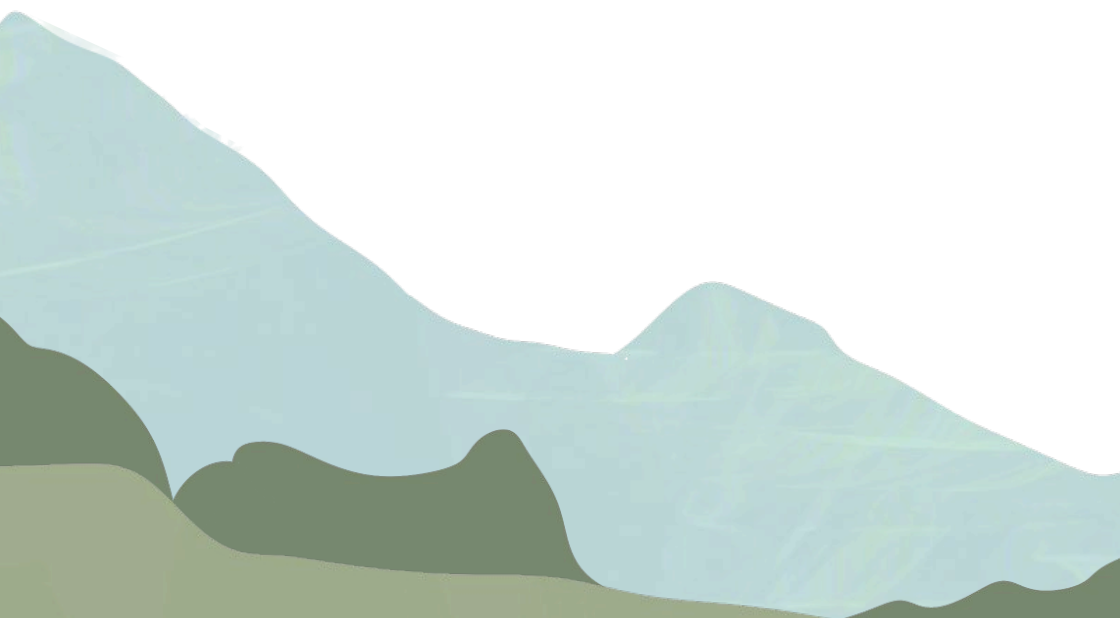

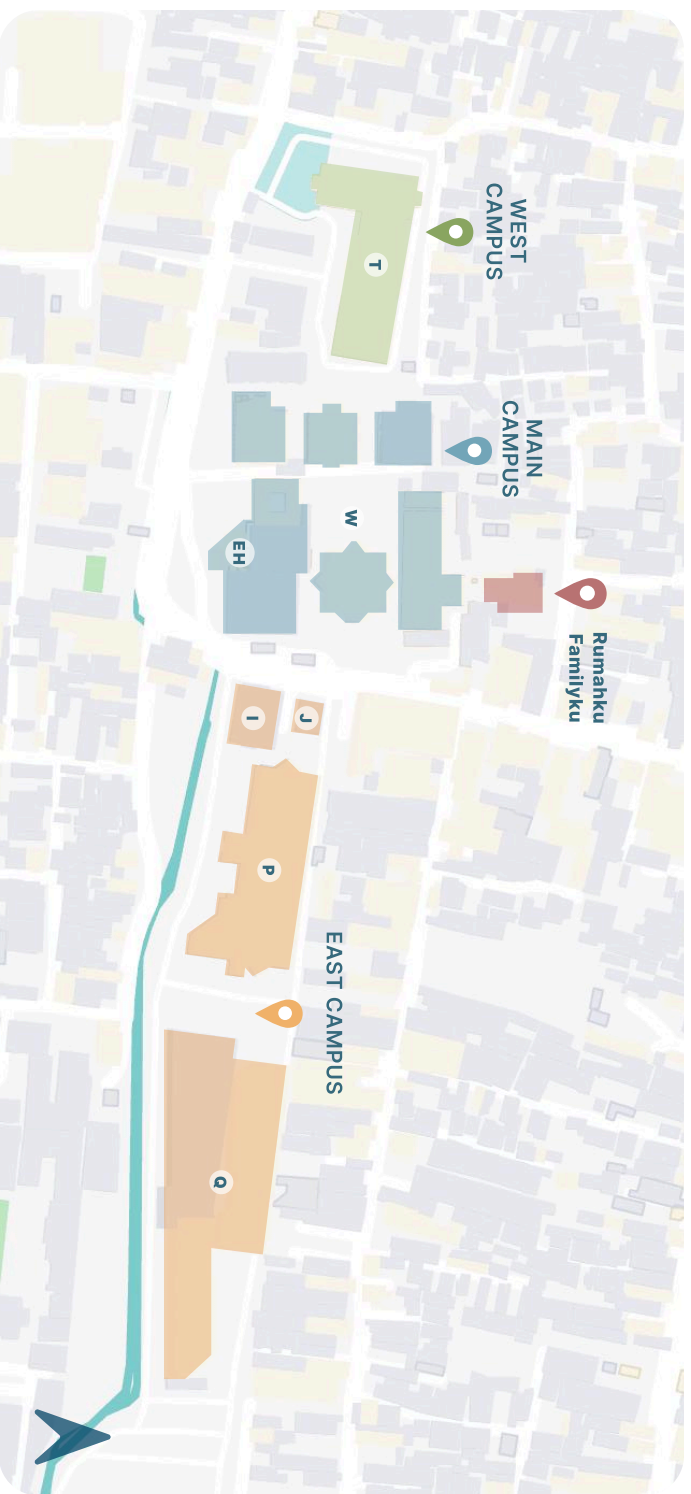
ABOUT PETRA CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY

Asia Summer Program (ASP) is a dynamic three-week international summer program designed to explore topics relevant to Asia while fostering global connections and leadership skills. ASP 2025 will be hosted by Petra Christian University in Surabaya, Indonesia, offering an unforgettable experience that combines academic enrichment, cultural immersion, and cross-cultural collaboration. This year ASP 2025 picks the theme One Asia, Many Stories: Celebrating Diversity.

Participants select two courses—one in the morning and one in the afternoon. These courses span topics primarily in liberal arts and humanities, with some introductory courses in other fields. Each course is typically worth three academic credits, which may be transferable towards graduation requirements at the student's home university, depending on individual institutional policies. Esteemed instructors from diverse participating universities deliver all courses fully in English

ASP 2025 is more than just academics; it is a journey of discovery. Students will participate in cultural activities and tours designed to highlight Indonesia's rich heritage, natural beauty, and unique traditions. These experiences foster a deeper understanding of the host country while creating bonds among participants from universities across Asia and beyond.

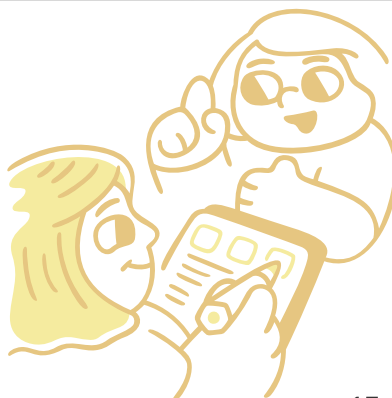

RULES FOR STUDENTS

ACADEMIC MATTERS

- 1 Students must attend and participate actively in all class sessions they are registered in for ASP 2025, including the Orientation, Opening and Closing Ceremonies.
- 2 When students miss their classes for more than 3 (three) sessions, they will get an F (Fail) grade for that course.
- 3 Students can only be granted special permissions in emergency cases. However, they must send their request for permission to the lecturer with a valid proof of their situation or condition which hampers their participation in the class.
- 4 Students are required to arrive on time for class. While late arrivals may be tolerated up to 15 (fifteen) minutes in exceptional cases, this should not be considered as a special treatment. Students arriving more than 15 minutes after the scheduled start time will not be admitted and will be marked absent.
- 5 Students should treat the lecturers and other students with respect and be conscious of cultural differences that might arise in any interactions.
- 6 Students are expected to always speak English and make efforts to mingle with students from countries that are different from their own.

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES

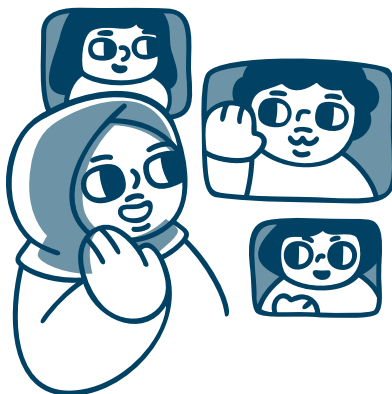
- 1 Daily lunch and dinner will be provided by the committee. For more details, please refer to section: **MEALS**.
- 2 Students should always carry the emergency contact information with them. Please refer to section: **EMERGENCY CONTACT DETAILS**.
- 3 Students are encouraged to join the extracurricular events, including the weekend trips which will introduce the culture of Indonesia and promote friendship among ASP participants. Please refer to the section: **ACTIVITIES**.
- 4 Students can use the campus facilities during the ASP 2025. Please refer to section: **ASP FACILITIES**.
- 5 Students are expected to always wear the ASP 2025 Name Tag while on the campus area. ASP 2025 T-shirts are to be worn for the Opening Ceremony & City Tour.
- 6 Participants are encouraged to bring their personal water tumbler to every activity.

LOCAL CULTURE AND CUSTOMS

(INCLUDING OUTING/TOUR PREPARATIONS)

- 1 PCU is a non-smoking campus. Smoking is **NOT** permitted on campus area.
- 2 Students should always use common sense when encountering any situations that are new or foreign to them. Do not hesitate to reach out to the student group leaders, ASP committees, or contact the ASP emergency numbers for consultation.

- 3 Students should dress properly according to the culture of Indonesia and the academic context at Petra Christian University. Basically, female skirt hemlines should fall below the knees, and the shoulders, back, stomach, and cleavage should always be covered, so no tank top and no sleeveless allowed on campus area. For male, avoid shorts at all costs and wear trousers instead. Shoes should be worn for all campus activities.
- 4 Students must pay extra attention to what they wear when they attend religious events or visit sacred places such as church and mosque. Avoid wearing see-through, sleeveless, tights, shorts, and slippers (flip-flops) because they are considered inappropriate for such occasions or places. Please also remove footwear when entering mosques or Hindu temples.
- 5 Students are advised to prepare themselves adequately before going on trips by bringing umbrellas, hats, sunglasses, applying sunblock, and wearing comfortable shoes. They should also keep their passports safely.
- 6 Never leave your belongings unattended everywhere you go.



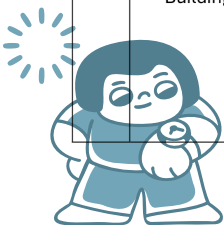
COURSES

Courses at ASP are taught by instructors from participating universities.

Each course is typically worth three academic credits which may be transferable to the student's home university upon successful completion. However, the acceptance and application of these credits toward graduation requirements are determined by the home university, with policies varying across institutions and countries. Therefore, students are encouraged to consult with the ASP representative at their home university and, if necessary, their academic advisor regarding credit transfer and applicability.

GRADING INFORMATION & POLICY

ASP offers 2 (two) courses, each is worth 3 (three) credits which gives a total of 6 (six) credits. Petra Christian University uses a criterion-referenced letter-grade system (A to E) based on a four-point scale to assess student learning outcomes for each course.



Student academic performance is expressed using letter grades and numerical values, as follows:

ASP 2025 at Petra Christian University offers a dynamic blend of academic enrichment, cultural exploration, sports, and international collaboration. All participants are required to attend the following main events:

Notes:

1. There will be an **optional Bromo tour** which requires registration.

 - a. Eco Canting Batik Workshop in the former Dolly red-light District. This activity needs registration and accommodates maximum 50 participants. First come first served.
 - b. Steaming Tradition: Putu also needs registration and accommodates maximum 20 participants.

Registration can be done during the orientation by contacting the available committee members.

Opening Ceremony & Welcome Banquet

- Participants are **required to wear the official ASP 2025 T-shirt**. This may be combined with neat long trousers, jeans, and closed shoes for a polished yet comfortable look.
- All participants **must wear their ASP 2025 name tags** during the ceremony.
- **Arrive on time** as the ceremony will begin promptly.

- 1 There will be a formal seating arrangement for both lecturers and students.
- 2 Lecturers will be seated in the front rows, grouped by partner universities, with clear signage.
- 3 Students will be seated by their home university and grouped by country to facilitate the roll call and encourage international mingling.

These general guidelines outline important rules and instructions that all participants must follow during the city tour to ensure a smooth, safe, and enjoyable experience.

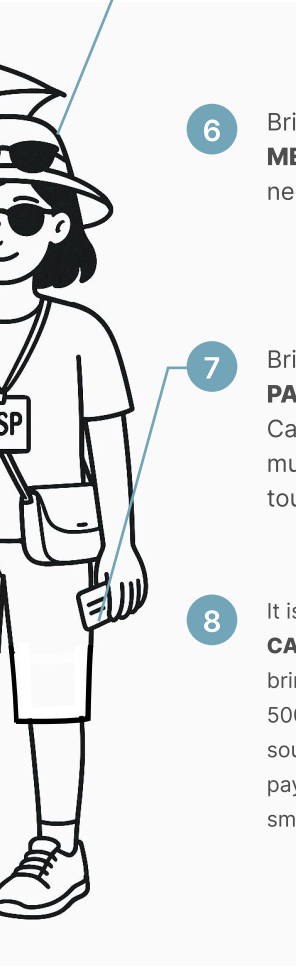
Carrying an **UMBRELLA** may also be helpful, due to Surabaya's tropical weather.

Wear casual, modest, and **COMFORTABLE CLOTHING** suitable for outdoor activities.

AVOID VERY SHORT SHORTS (hot pants) and sleeveless tops.

CLOSED SHOES or comfortable walking footwear are required.





5 **A HAT, SUNGLASSES, and SUNBLOCK** are highly recommended.

6 Bring any **PERSONAL MEDICATION** you may need.

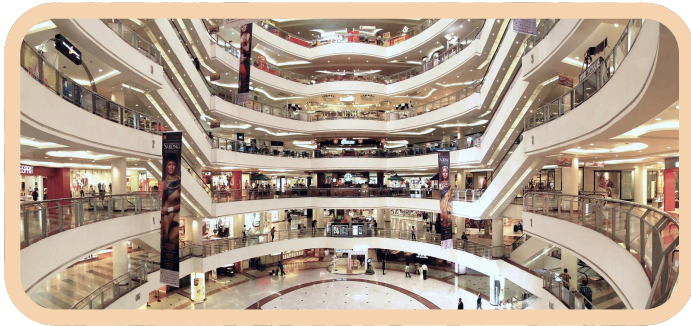

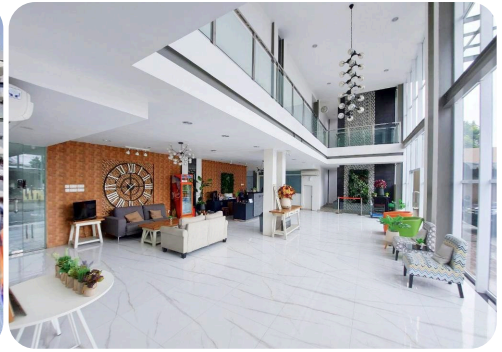
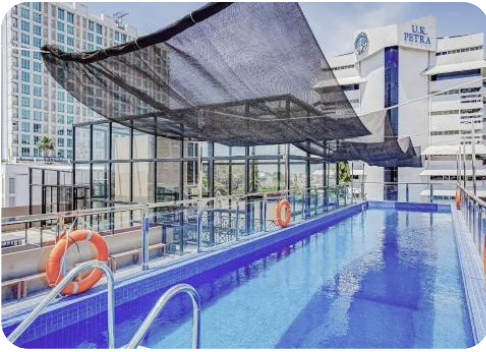
